Why do treatments work for some patients but not others? Why does a cancer recur in some people? Why do some cancers behave more aggressively than others? Unlocking answers to these questions will help us improve the outcomes and experience of people living with cancer.

My research focus is on “cancer heterogeneity”; this challenging problem spans projects across the research spectrum, from patient experience, through clinical trials, translational biomarkers and questions in basic science.

I’m a physician/scientist, dual trained as a medical oncologist and basic science researcher. I work for patients with melanoma, brain, kidney, prostate, testis, and bladder cancer at the Calvary Mater Newcastle, and I’m the Clinical Research Director at the NSW Statewide Biobank. I chair the Renal Cancer Subcommittee for the ANZUP Cancer Trials Group, and undertake translational cancer research at the Hunter Medical Research Institute, University of Newcastle.
